

Ex 1: 1-7

These are the names of the sons of Israel who, accompanied by their households, entered into Egypt with Jacob: Reuben, Simeon, Levi and Judah; Issachar, Zebulun and Benjamin; Dan and Naphtali; Gad and Asher. The total number of Jacob's direct descendants was seventy. Joseph was already in Egypt. Now Joseph and all his brothers and that whole generation died. But the Israelites were fruitful and prolific. They multiplied and became so very numerous that the land was filled with them.

Philippians 3:7-14

(But) whatever gains I had, these I have come to consider a loss because of Christ. More than that, I even consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God, depending on faith to



know him and the power of his resurrection and (the) sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. It is not that I have already taken hold of it or have already attained perfect maturity, but I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it, since I have indeed been taken possession of by Christ (Jesus). Brothers, I for my part do not consider myself to have taken possession. Just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus.

Matthew 10:1-7

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon the Cananean, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

Why 12 Disciples?

The number 12 has significant meaning in the Bible. It was significant for Jesus to choose 12 apostles instead of another number. The apostles represented God's new covenant, just as the 12 tribes of Israel represented the old covenant (Luke 22:29-30).

The number 12 often signifies a complete divine arrangement or organization. Here are just a few appearances of the number 12 in the Bible.

- Jesus was 12 years old when he was left behind in the temple. When he was found, he was among the religious leaders (Luke 2:42, 49-52).
- Jesus raised Jarius' 12-year-old daughter from a death-like state (Mark 5:42).
- The miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fishes, providing 12 baskets of food (Matthew 14:19-20; John 6:13).
- Jacob had 12 sons, each of whom became father to one of the 12 tribes of Israel.
- According to Revelation 12:12, the New Jerusalem will have the names of the 12 disciples on the foundation of the 12 walls.
- Guarding the heavenly gates are 12 angels (Revelation 12:12).
