

Sunday Gospel Reading

Matthew 24:1-14

Jesus left the temple area and was going away, when his disciples approached him to point out the temple buildings. He said to them in reply, "You see all these things, do you not? Amen, I say to you, there will not be left here a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." As he was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples approached him privately and said, "Tell us, when will this happen, and what sign will there be of your coming, and of the end of the age?" Jesus said to them in reply, "See that no one deceives you. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the Messiah,' and they will deceive many. You will hear of wars and reports of wars; see that you are not alarmed, for these things must happen, but it will not yet be the end. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be famines and earthquakes from place to place. All these are the beginning of the labor pains. Then they will hand you over to persecution, and they will kill you. You will be hated by all nations because of my name. And then many will be led into sin; they will betray and hate one another. Many false prophets will arise and deceive many; and because of the increase of evildoing, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who perseveres to the end will be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached throughout the world as a witness to all nations, and then the end will come.

Many Christians describe praying the **Holy Rosary** as like sitting with an old friend and listening to stories that shape you. Each bead, each "Hail Mary," isn't just a repetition; it's a meditation on the life of Jesus and the loving heart of Mary.

The rhythm of the prayers has a way of quieting the noise in our minds so

we can walk through the mysteries of Christ's life, one by one – His birth, His ministry, His suffering, and His Resurrection. As you move from one mystery to the next, you're invited to see those events through Mary's eyes: her wonder at the Annunciation, her sorrow at the foot of the Cross, her joy at the Resurrection. People often turn to the Rosary in difficult moments because its simplicity and familiarity



bring peace. A grandmother in a hospital room; a parent worrying about a child; a student facing a big decision – the beads become a lifeline that keeps them connected to God's love. At the same time, countless saints have prayed these same prayers, so there's a sense of unity with generations of faith before us.

Most of all, praying the Rosary regularly helps many Christians grow closer to Christ. The prayers aren't magic words but a framework for looking at His life again and again. Like returning to a favorite story that always has something new to teach you, the Rosary invites you to let those mysteries sink in and change you. In the quiet repetition there's space for God to speak, and in offering the prayer you give Him your time and attention.


