

Three lessons from this week's gospel reading.

- 1. *Discipleship is shared—and funded—by many gifts* (8:1–3). Luke spotlights Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Susanna who "provided for them out of their means." Jesus' mission advances through hidden service and generous stewardship. *Practice:* name one hidden helper in your parish or family and thank them; consider one concrete act of support for the Gospel this week.
- 2. *Check your soil: depth and weeds matter* (8:11–14). The "rocky" hearer receives with joy but has no root and withers under testing; the "thorny" hearer lets anxieties, riches, and pleasures choke the word. *Practice:* pick one "rooting" habit (daily Scripture, quiet prayer, weekly Mass beyond obligation) and pull one "thorn" (a worry you entrust to God, a spending/scrolling habit you limit).
- 3. Fruit comes "with patience" (8:15). The good soil is a "noble and good heart" that hears, holds fast, and bears fruit with patient endurance. Grace is generous, but growth is gradual. Practice: hold one verse this week (e.g., Lk 8:15) and return to it daily; measure faith by faithfulness, not by feelings.

"Lord, make my heart good soil—deepen my roots, clear my thorns, and help me bear fruit with patience.

Amen."

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY OF PENTECOST SEASON

Gen 2: 8-10 + 15-17


The LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made grow every tree that was delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. A river rises in Eden to water the garden; beyond there it divides and becomes four

branches. The LORD God then took the man and settled him in the garden of Eden, to cultivate and care for it. The LORD God gave the man this order: You are free to eat from any of the trees of the garden except the tree of knowledge of good and evil. From that tree you shall not eat; when you eat from it you shall die.

1 Corinthians 3:1-11

Brothers, I could not talk to you as spiritual people, but as fleshly people, as infants in Christ. I fed you milk, not solid food, because you were unable to take it. Indeed, you are still not able, even now, for you are still of the flesh. While there is jealousy and rivalry among you, are you not of the flesh, and behaving in an ordinary human way? Whenever someone says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," are you not merely human? What is Apollos, after all, and what is Paul?

Ministers through whom you became believers, just as the Lord assigned each one. I planted, Apollos watered, but God caused the





Afterward he journeyed from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. Accompanying him were the Twelve and some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza,

Susanna, and many others who provided for them out of their resources. When a large crowd gathered, with people from one town after another journeying to him, he spoke in a parable. "A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path and was trampled, and the birds of the sky ate it up. Some seed fell on rocky ground, and when it grew, it withered for lack of moisture. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some seed fell on good soil, and when it grew, it produced fruit a hundredfold." After saying this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear ought to hear." Then his disciples asked him what the meaning of this parable might be. He

answered, "Knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of God has been granted to you; but to the rest, they are made known through parables so that 'they may look but not see, and hear but not

understand.' "This is the meaning of the parable. The seed is the word of God. Those on the path are the ones who have heard, but the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts that they may not believe and be saved. Those on rocky ground are the ones who, when they hear, receive the word with joy, but they have no root; they believe only for a time and fall away in time of trial. As for the seed that fell among thorns, they are the ones who have heard, but as they go along, they are choked by the anxieties and riches and pleasures of life, and they fail to produce mature fruit. But as for the seed that fell on rich soil, they are the ones who, when they have heard the word, embrace it with a generous and good heart, and bear fruit through perseverance.
