Gen 1: 20-23

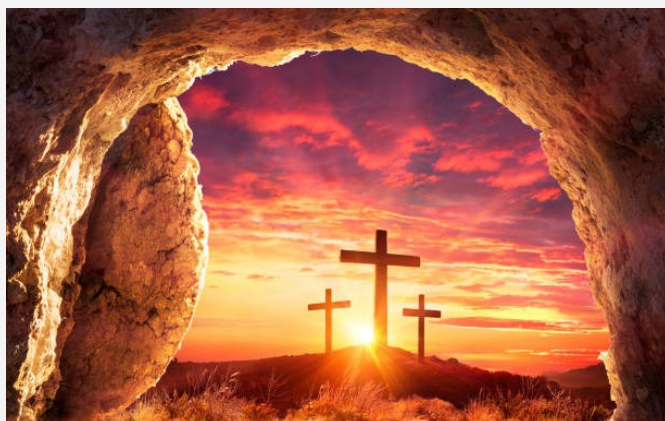
Then God said: Let the water teem with an abundance of living creatures, and on the earth let birds fly beneath the dome of the sky. God created the great sea monsters and all kinds of crawling living creatures with which the water teems, and all kinds of winged birds. God saw that it was good, and God blessed them, saying: Be fertile, multiply, and fill the water of the seas; and let the birds multiply on the earth. John 21:1-14

After this, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. This is the Truth. Peace be with you.

Who is Bishop Michel Aoun?

He is a strong, capable, and dedicated leader who heads the Eparchy of Jbeil/Byblos in Lebanon.

Bishop Aoun has made substantial ecclesiastical, superintendent, and educational contributions and provided leadership within the Maronite Patriarchate in Lebanon and abroad. Nationally, Bishop Aoun has acted as liaison for the country's Catholic patriarchs and bishops with Caritas. Bishop Aoun has been hard at work on the livelihood, health and social care for needy families and disabled elderly, including retired priests in the Eparchy of Jbeil, who are growing old without any social protection. To complement his efforts in Lebanon's unprecedented economic



crisis that grows more dire by the day, Bishop Aoun has devoted the time and energy for a pastoral visit to cultivate the laity in Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Specifically, Bishop Aoun is keen to meet you and get you apprised of his humanitarian program and support for the vulnerable community in his Eparchy.

According to the United Nations, eight out of 10 people in Lebanon now live below the poverty line, and Lebanon has the greatest number of elderly in the Middle East.

Humanitarian relief

Medication and treatment to those who can't afford the prices of the private Lebanese healthcare system.

Medication needed to treat chronic conditions.

Residents living in extreme poverty without food and clothing.

Social care

Elderly priests without social protection, pension or healthcare coverage, and no financial support from family.

Special needs wheelchairs for children, adults and elderly with unique mobility requirements.

Mental health support services.
